About the KSU Vision Session

YBhg. Dato' Dr. Noorul shared her beliefs on the need to further equip oneself with knowledge. Her view on that is only through extensive reading that one can further expand on ideas and speak out based on issues. Her parting quote was to “strive for excellence and success will come naturally.”

About the Speaker

At present, Dato' Dr. Noorul Ainur Mohd Nur spearheads the Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development as the ministry's secretary general. Her significant contributions to women's advancement has led to her appointment as Malaysia's Representative for Women's Right to the ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of the Rights of Women and Children in 2010. She headed the Malaysian delegation in the 4th East Asia Ministerial Meeting on gender equality in post economic crisis and women's empowerment. Dato' Dr. Noorul Ainur has more than 25 years' of experience in the public sector. In the international arena, being an expert who specializes in the fields of development administration and economics, she served as the Senior Advisor in the Southeast Asia Group, for the World Bank in Washington D.C. during the period of 2006-2008. She obtained her PhD in Political Science with a specialization in the effects of privatization in Malaysia at the crossroads. She is a recipient of the Goldman Sachs Visiting Research Fellowship to undertake her post-doctoral work at the University of Oxford.

Objectives

The objective of the KSU Vision is to allow KSUs to share their Vision for their Ministries and steps in achieving it. The session also provides a platform for exchange of experience, sharing of knowledge and contestation of ideas between KSU and the audience.

Programme Outcomes

The recurring message throughout the session was to provide gender sensitisation to ensure the mission and vision of KWPKM is achieved. Sharing her thoughts on the 'road to excellence', she stressed on 'creativity as currency of the future' – understanding the need to apply different methods in problem-solving and application of unconventional methods in a given situation. She also believes that taking risks are part and parcel of decision-making and leadership, and it has to be backed up with substantial knowledge and information.
